PHD DEFENSE TO COME

Defense of Qing Ou on "Fusing Heterogeneous Traffic Data: Parsimonious Approaches using Data-Data Consistency".

The defense will be held on May 9th, 2011 at 12:30 h. in the Auditorium of the Aula, Mekelweg 5 in Delft.

PROMOTIONS OF APRIL

Niels van Oort on "Service Reliability and Urban Public Transport Design". Service reliability is an important quality characteristic of public transport. This thesis presents an analysis of the causes and of the passenger impacts of unreliability of urban public transport services. Planning instruments are introduced enabling a costeffective increase of service reliability. This thesis demonstrates that during the network and timetable design of public transport several opportunities exist to increase the level of service reliability substantially.





Shu Lin on "Efficient Model Pedictive Control for Large-Scale Urban Traffic Networks. Model Predictive Control is applied to control and coordinate large-scale urban traffic networks. However, due to the large scale or the nonlinear, non-convex nature of the on-line optimization problems solved, the MPC controllers become real-time infeasible in practice, even though the problem is solvable in theory. In this thesis, we mainly focus on the solutions for increasing the real-time feasibility of the MPC controllers for large-scale urban traffic networks.

Leonie Walta on "Getting ADAS on the Road". Advanced Driver Assistance Systems (ADAS) are electronic systems that support car drivers in their driving task, for example by automatically following the car in front of them. These systems can potentially contribute to the solution of transport problems, such as traffic accidents and congestion. This thesis focuses on the deployment of ADAS by studying the interactions between public authorities, the automotive industry, insurance companies and users. The results show that the automotive industry is likely to be the leading actor in ADAS deployment. Public authorities can have a substantial influence but are not expected to take action first. Insurance companies are not likely to play a large role.
